Bee E. Diester, secretary to Carl A. Strand of the Carl A. Strand Company, is another charter member of the newly-formed chapter.

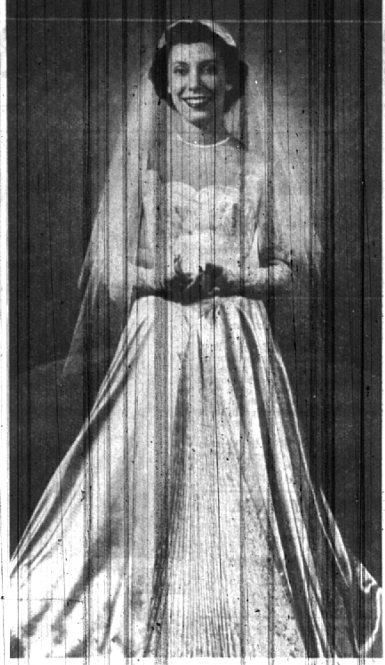
Formal installation is scheduled for eight o'clock Friday evening, May 15, at the Hotel Waldron.

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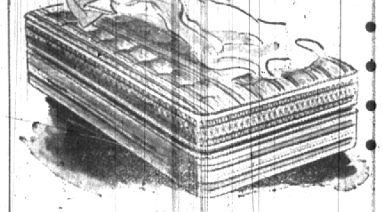
