

## Parents Organize CAP Auxiliary

Open house and parents' night for the Birmingham Civil Air Patrol cadet program was held at the high school Thursday evening. Forty parents watched their cadets and daughters give marching drill, and heard the cadets tell of the various studies in the Civil Air Cadet program.

The program was under the direction of the Executive Officer, Captain George Renzoli, and the Commandant of Cadets, Captain Robert Berkey. Cadet Lieutenant Robert Owen introduced eleven ca-

dets who made short speeches describing their studies.

Subjects included the work of the cadets on rescue missions, encampment at Selfridge Air Base, first aid and survival operations in case of A-bomb attack, aircraft structure and power plants, navigation, history of the Civil Air Patrol and wartime services rendered, and the place of girls in the program.

Membership in the program is available to high school students.

By-laws were accepted and the following officers elected for the first year: Clyde L. Reed, president; Robert Owen, Sr., vice president; Mrs. Russell Hibbard, treasurer; and Mrs. Charles Thurston, secretary.

## Detroit Pastor Sees No Threat Of Atomic War

Decrying the current propaganda that argues "the United States and the rest of the world are living on the brink of self-destruction," Rev. Allen M. Frue, minister of Detroit's First Presbyterian church, told members of Birmingham's High Twelve club Monday night that "atomic warfare is destined for mothballs."

Dr. Allen, who spoke to an audience of 200 men at the Community House, concluded his talk with the statement: "For many years we have been moving from crisis to crisis, we are aware of the peril confronting us, but the terrible power of atomic and hydrogen bombs has brought us to a position where we will not commit suicide by using it... which then will allow the influence of God's laws to bring about a lasting peace."

THE SPEAKER NARRATED the history of the Russian people over the past several centuries, revealing that she has a right to fear foreigners and their efforts to con-

quer her. This fear, he argued, made it necessary, following World War II, to surround her borders with protective satellite countries.

Because of the great devastation of her country in the last war, Russia has not the resources to engage in another conflict, when she knows she can't win it, Dr. Allen said.

Communism is an economic ideology, and while we know that the current rulers of the Soviet State seek to conquer the whole earth, that ideology will expend itself in due time," declared Dr. Allen. "Primarily, though, Russia is interested in protecting her borders against invasion by the western powers."

DR. ALLEN ALSO said that the leadership shown by the United States in Korea has proved to the whole world that this nation is dedicated to defend the cause of human freedom, and he praised President Truman's action in rushing American military forces there to meet the Communist invasion of South Korea.

Dr. Allen told his audience that "Korea, history will prove, is comparable to the symbol of Petersburg and Stalingrad. The ability of the UN to stop the Reds in Korea represents one of the great moments in modern history. It is the turning of the tide by freedom-loving peoples against tyranny," he said.

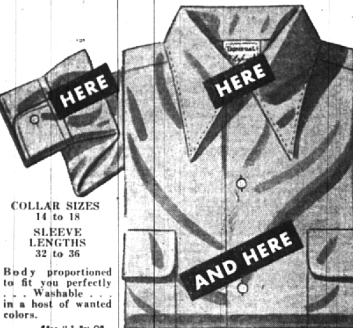

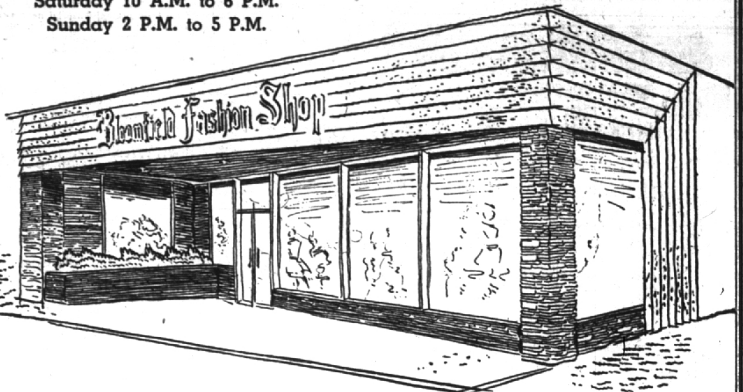
