Newly elected officers are Wynfred Wagner, vice president; Helen Chanaay, secretary; and Ann Gardner, treasurer. A president will be elected later.

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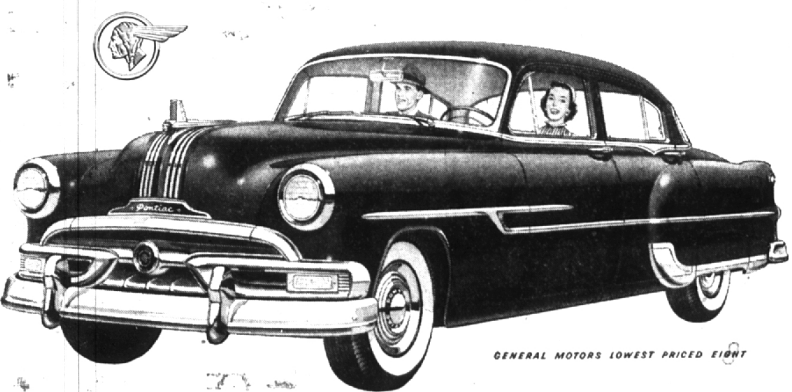
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
