City Reminded Of Traffic Snarl On West Maple

Traffic congestion on W. Maple in front of the shopping center west of Chesterfield came up before the city commission again Monday night when Edith P. Dowd, 588 Larches, offered his suggestions to alleviate the problem.

Dowd suggested that left turns from Maple into parking lots in front of the stores be banned during the hours of peak traffic. He said left turns onto Chesterfield should also be banned during these hours.

Dowd recommends a traffic signal for eastbound traffic in front of the Larches intersection on Maple.

ALSO, ACCORDING TO Dowd, property behind the stores should be acquired for use as a parking lot to be operated either by the city or by a private concern.

City commissioners said they are trying to work out a plan for a parking lot in the area but are being hampered by subdivision restrictions.

It was announced that a hearing on the subject is scheduled for Dec. 7.

In the meantime, Dowd's suggestions have been referred to Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley for further study.

Grading, Seeding For City Dump

A \$500 appropriation to aid in the cleanup and grading of certain portions of the city dump on E. Maple was given the approval of Birmingham city commissioners.

The money will be used for seeding of the western area being filled by the Southeastern Oakland County Garbage and Rubbish Disposal Authority, plus grading of portions in the eastern half which the authority will not use.

To call farther away—but still within your direct dialing range—you'll just dial the three code figures that route your call to the proper area, and then the TWO LETTERS and FIVE NUMERALS of the telephone number. In a matter of seconds, the distant telephone will start to ring.

A booklet listing all the towns you can dial direct, and telling how to call people there, has been sent to every Birmingham customer. It will help you take full advantage of this newest development providing more and better telephone service for your telephone dollar.
