County Disaster Institute Planned

Tentative plans for a disaster institute and a review of present county disaster plans will be discussed at a committee meeting Tuesday night at the Oakland county American Red Cross chapter house in Pontiac.

Scheduled for sometime after the first of the year, the disaster institute would include training sessions and talks for Red Cross and civil defense volunteers.

Attending the Tuesday night planning discussion will be County Red Cross Disaster Chairman Bradlee Pruden, 491 Hanna; the disaster sub-chairman, Harold Euler, who also is chairman of the county Red Cross chapter; Ralph Gentle, the Red Cross Midwest office's director of disaster for Michigan; and Jack Soomer, general field representative for South-eastern Michigan chapters exclusive of Detroit.

Five CAP Cadets Gain Scholarship At MSC Program

Flight training scholarships were awarded this week to five Birmingham cadets of the Civil Air Patrol program, in ceremonies on the Michigan State College campus.

Cadets from the Birmingham area receiving scholarships were Robert Owen, Ruth Hubbard, William Heyniger, John Shaffer and Willard Newman. Four of the Birmingham scholarships are being sponsored by the Michigan Wing of the Civil Air Patrol, and one is sponsored by the Perendale Surplus Outlet Company.

Each cadet receives \$115 in flight instruction time at Big Beaver Airport. This much time usually allows the cadet to complete his dual training, and to start solo flying.

This type of training has proved helpful to boys who later enter flight training in the armed services, as indicated by only 7% of these boys dropping out before completion of training as compared to 40% dropping out who have not had previous flight training experience.

SIXTY-EIGHT scholarships were awarded at the ceremonies in Lansing, attended by 200 cadets and parents from all sections of the state.

General Clyde E. Dougherty in charge of Civil Defense for Michigan spoke to the cadets about the necessity of continuing civilian interest in the defense of our state and the role of the Civil Air Patrol to have in the Civilian Defense Program.

The Birmingham cadet program is open to high school students and meets on Thursday evenings at the high school.

Replat Called Benefit for Subdivision

A replatting of several city-owned lots on Shephardsh adjustment was endorsed by city commissioners Monday night.

They agreed with City Manager D. C. Egbert's recommendation that the rearrangement would permit the property to develop for single family residences.

The move will require vacation of a portion of Shephardsh, and planting of a foliage screen along the railroad.

THE IDEA has met with the approval of the subdivision association and the builder who is developing several lots in the immediate vicinity, Egbert asserted.

"The proposed plan will, in the opinion of the plan board and ourselves, result in a greatly improved situation for this portion of the subdivision, and should provide an environment which will permit of the development of these lots for single family use," Egbert said.
