

Bowl Set Earns Ceramics Awards

Black and white striped porcelain bowls took a state prize for John A. Foster, 1166 North Woodward in the "Designer-Craftsman U. S. A." show running at the Brooklyn (N. Y.) Museum.

The set of four bowls, one large and three small matching units hold both the Webber and Jensen awards.

Foster, who studied at the Wicker Art school and the University of Michigan, served with the Navy Expeditionary Force in France in 1918. He has a background of chemical, metallurgical and ceramic engineering with the Ford Motor company and was identified with the establishment of the Greenfield Village pottery.

He has had a wide experience as a teacher of ceramic arts and has traveled extensively studying collections and ceramic works.

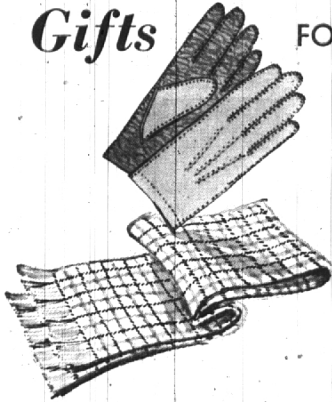
