

## High Varsity Club Inducts Members

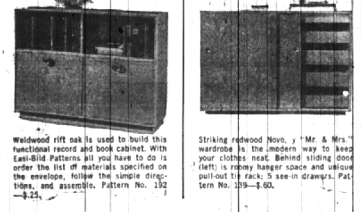

## Venison Recipe

- (1) Place venison roast in roasting pan and cover lightly with a tenderizer salt and leave at room temperature for 4 or 5 hours.
- (2) Cover top of roast with thin slice of salt pork and dust with black pepper.
- (3) Place in a hot oven—100 degrees—and keep heat steady until the roast begins to sear.
- (4) Reduce heat and baste every ten minutes with a red wine... 1 to 1 1/2 cups.
- (5) Then baste with the juices in the pan until the roast is done... be careful not to over cook.
