**Maples Downed By Hurons**

Overall power made the difference when Port Huron defeated Birmingham 34-7 last Friday night at Pierce field. The Maples successfully bottled up the visitors' star full-back Al Davis but were unable to contain fleet halfbacks Bob Boyd and Dave Winfield.

From the start it was evident that the Hurons were not to be denied. The first time they got their hands on the ball they marched 60 yards in nine plays. Boyd climaxed the drive when he went over his right end for the first of his three touchdowns. Davis converted, making the score 7-0. In the second stanza Boyd again tallied, plunging three yards for the counter. Davis converted for the point.

Opening the third period the Blue Water boys covered 62 yards in four plays, Boyd plunging two yards through center. Davis' extra point raised the margin to 21-0.

EARLY IN the fourth quarter Maple Jim Fraa recovered a Port Huron fumble on the visitor's ten. The Maples, however, were pushed back to the 32 where the Big Red again took over on downs.

On the next play Dave Baker, a substitute Huron halfback circled left end for 68 yards and a score on the most spectacular play of the game. Davis converted his fourth straight extra point.

The Maples then came to life and fought back their aerial game beginning to click. Quarterback Jerry Wedge completed two passes for 29 yards, then carried the pigskin himself for 16 more. Sophomore Bill Swaney capped the march with a one yard plunge.

Bill Watkinson converted, and local fans finally had something they could cheer about.

In the last minute of play Port Huron added still another score when Winfield reached pay dirt from five yards out.

THE USUALLY competent Maple defense was no match for the hard-charging Hurons. The visitors rolled up 219 yards on their crushing ground game to only 24 for the locals. Only passing gave the Maples a semblance of an attack.

Birmingham Coach Vincent Secotine was disappointed with the general showing of his squad.

This game wound up the Maples league schedule with one win, three losses, and one tie.

The Maples travel to Waterford tomorrow afternoon to take on the Skippers. The game will begin at 3:30.
