**Halloween Parade May End Up on Woodward Avenue**  
The city's annual Halloween parade Oct. 31 may wind up in the center of town, rather than at Hill school, as it has in past years.  
This was revealed Monday night when party chairman Rowland W. Reese asked and obtained city permission to hold the parade between Maple and Woodward avenues for the food lines.  
Reese now must contact the Briggs Commercial and Development Co. for permission to use the Briggs parking lot on the east side of Woodward.  
This new arrangement, Reese explained to commissioners, would permit more food lines to be established, thus clearing city streets faster.  
If BRIGGS approves use of its lot, the parade would start from Hill school area and proceed east on Maple, then down Woodward to the food lines.  
Reese said entertainment would be provided on the parking lot to attract the children under the third grade and the parents, thereby getting them off Woodward so it could be opened about three hours after it was blocked off.  
After they get their food, the third graders and above will leave almost immediately for the special entertainment programs planned at various schools and other assembly points, he concluded.

**Townships, Cities Move To Study Sewer Authority**

Preliminary steps to abate pollution of the Rouge river were taken Wednesday morning, Sept. 23, by members of the advisory committee studying the possibility of constructing a interceptor sewer to carry sanitary wastes from portions of Bloomfield, Southfield and Troy townships and a section of Birmingham to the Detroit sewage disposal system.  
The committee met in the offices of the City of Bloomfield Hills and agreed that the municipalities engaged in creating the sewer authority should seek the assistance of Claude Stevens for legal advice and Matthew Carey as financial consultant.  
Members are attempting to meet with representatives of the state health department and Water Resources Commission to discuss an interceptor system on Oct. 14.  
THE CITY commission Monday also approved extension of sewerage treatment contracts with the City of Bloomfield Hills, and the Oakland Hills Country Club until a solution to the sewer disposal problem is found.  
Meanwhile, city officials are studying possible improvements to the aeration equipment at the city's treatment plant.  
City Manager Donald C. Eberst explained to commissioners that he would submit a report as soon as possible on proposed improvements to the mechanisms.  
Eberst added that funds in the water department account would probably cover the cost of the improvements.
