The final day for registration at the township hall, 26080 Berg road, is Oct. 5, just four days away. Hours for registration are until 5 p.m. Thursday, 8 to 5 Friday, 8 until 12 noon on Saturday, and 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. next Monday.

If you are not registered, do it now. The township hall may be reached by turning east off Telegraph road onto 10 1/4 Mile road and then going north about 200 feet on Berg road.
