Southfield Acts To Curb Loitering

A disorderly persons ordinance has been adopted by Southfield township board members. The ordinance takes effect 30 days after publication.

The ordinance is aimed directly at curbing loitering around township restaurants because of resident complaints of excessive noise and reckless driving attributed to teenage "hot rod" gangs.

Troy Schools Sell \$700,000 In Bldg. Bonds

Plans for expansion of facilities at the Troy district schools received a green light with the sale of \$700,000 worth of bonds at the board of education meeting last week according to Stuart K. Baker, superintendent.

Only bidder for the bonds was H. V. Sattley, Inc., of Detroit, whose bid calls for an average interest rate of 4.13 per cent. Unless the board uses provision to call in a portion of the bonds at an earlier date, they will be retired in 1970, Baker said.

Interest on the bonds will be 4.25 per cent until 1969 when it will drop to 4 per cent. In 1970 during the last year before their retirement they will yield 3 1/2 per cent.

MONEY FROM the sale of the bonds will be used to build additions to three elementary schools, and to build a new junior high school building.

In other business last week the board voted to allow payment of \$14 per day to teachers working on a substitute basis.

The board also hired a new teacher, Asley Harold Hogen, to bring Troy high school's English department to full strength.

Next meeting of the board has been set for Oct. 6, at 8 p.m. when final plans for school construction will be presented for approval to clear the way for construction to commence.
