Dr. Paul Weaver, president of Lake Erie college at Painesville, Ohio, will speak to the college alumnae group at 8 p.m., Monday, Oct. 5, at the Rackham building.

Mrs. W. D. Draper of Bloomfield Hills and Mrs. A. H. Coppel, Jr., and Mrs. Robert F. Morse of Birmingham are on the committee in charge of the meeting.

Prior to assuming the presidency of Lake Erie college, Dr. Weaver was dean of religious life at Stephens college, Mo., where he led the nationally known Burrall class, a class of over 6000 students from the three colleges in that community.

Dr. Weaver personally developed the Lake Erie Winter Term Abroad for Juniors plan, which began last year. The entire junior class now goes abroad for its winter term, spending time with families in Copenhagen, Barcelona and Grenoble.

A graduate of Franklin and Marshall college, Dr. Weaver spent five years in graduate study at Yale university and received an honorary doctorate from Franklin and Marshall several years ago.
