Pembroke School Contracts Up For Construction Bids

Bids for construction of the proposed \$600,000 Pembroke school in Birmingham are being sought following an agreement for handling storm and sanitary sewage in the area, according to Dept. of Schools Dwight B. Ireland.

Ireland said that interested parties along with the municipalities of Troy township and Birmingham had reached a decision on an equitable distribution of the estimated \$200,000 cost of the sewage project.

The distribution of costs are: Arthur Nechman, building developer, \$102,662; the Presbyterian church, \$31,285; developer Frank Gebel, \$48,665; and Birmingham board of education, \$18,961.

DISTRIBUTION was figured on a basis of 50 per cent for frontage in the area and 50 per cent for total area occupied.

Ireland said that attorneys now are meeting to draw up the final agreements.

Each of the participating parties has advanced three per cent of the agreed-upon amount for preliminary engineering studies preparatory to preparing contracts for bids.

Ireland said that the costs agreed on are tentative, and that when the bids are in, there may be some slight variation, either more or less, in the final costs.

He concluded that the board of education is confident that there will be no hitch in present plans and therefore, the board will give construction bids on the Pembroke school on Nov. 17.

City To Celebrate UN's 8th Birthday

A parade, an auction and a talk by Clark M. Eichelberger, director of the American Association for the United Nations, will be the city's way of celebrating United Nations Day tonight, Oct. 22.

Both Boy and Girl Scout members will join in a parade to the Community House carrying both the flags of the United States and the UN.

The League of Women Voters, through the effort of Mrs. Charles Shum, has invited Eichelberger, recognized authority on the U.N., to lecture on "Facts and Fallacies of the United Nations." His talk is slated for the 8:30 p.m. meeting at the Community House.

THE AUCTION will be held to sell a large birthday cake commemorating the birth of the UN Organization. William Spence will auction the cake off at the end of the evening program. The cake, a gift of the MOMS club, was baked by Mrs. Manson Hillman. Proceeds of the sale will be used for the U. N.'s Children's Relief fund.

Helping to make the program a success will be Mrs. Dorothy Roosevelt, pianist, and representatives of the Birmingham Garden Club and the Birmingham Junior League.

Rezoning Request Hearing Is Called

A public hearing to consider the rezoning of six lots on the east side of Southfield between Fourteen Mile and Southdown has been set for Nov. 16 by the city commission.
