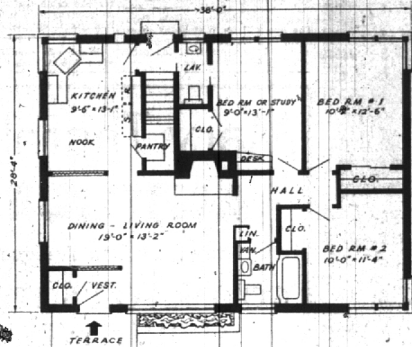

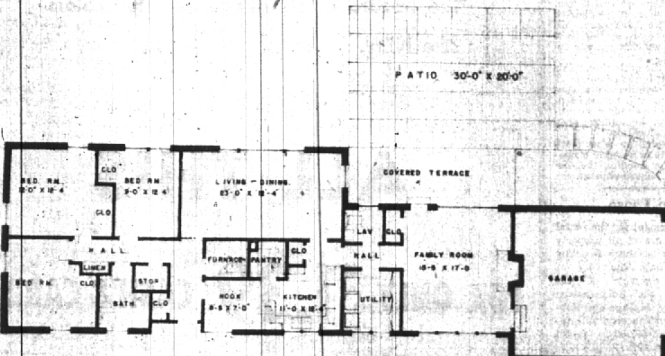

**Needlework Guild's Year Ends Wednesday**

The final summation of a year's work will be noted Oct. 28 when the Birmingham-Bloomfield Hills branch of the Needlework Guild of America has its annual breakfast and in-gathering.

Mrs. Lloyd H. Diehl, Jr., chairman, has been assisted by Mrs. John Judd, in charge of organizing garments; Mrs. Robert N. Woodruff, who has charge of distribution of garments to working on a national; Mrs. Parsons Neff, treasurer and Mrs. Farbury Schmidt, corresponding secretary with her aide, Mrs. Wesslau Wright.

Mrs. Glen R. Miller, seventh president of the local organization, said about a quarter of the new garments are made available to the Red Cross for distribution among disaster victims.

The national organization is made up of more than 500 guilds throughout the United States and Canada. Each year thousands of garments are made by these members to be given to persons suffering all types of misfortune.

**MORE THAN 62 million** garments have been distributed since the organization was founded in 1885 at Philadelphia.

Mrs. Benjamin Brewster, publicity chairman, said a unique feature of the group not generally known is their readiness to answer an appeal quickly and without fuss. The Guild, working on a national basis, is geared to supply thousands of garments within a matter of hours should the need arise. Selection, packing and distribution is carefully planned so that only a brief time need pass between the call and delivery.

The local Guild's first president and one of the founders, Mrs. Carleton C. Patterson, now holds the title of honorary president for the Birmingham-Bloomfield group.

**FOUNDED 23 years ago**, the local group has drawn from all churches and organizations within the area. It has no affiliations with any group, working independently to supply the needs of those in distress.

In one release the Guild was described as "an organization that functions with a minimum of red tape, social meetings and organized affairs."

"The board may meet throughout the year to solve problems, but for the membership, it is a case of make as many items of clothing as possible. For these ranks of workers there is one meeting—our annual breakfast and in-gathering," Mrs. Brewster said.

"THIS IS THE climax, the high point of our year. To every member we have, it is the day of seeing, all together, the labors of many workers and many hours. The Guild needs no social life, it has personal satisfaction and the "good" feeling that comes from

helping others less fortunate than ourselves."

The 1963 breakfast, to be served at the Community House at 10:30 a.m., will be in charge of Mrs. George Collins.

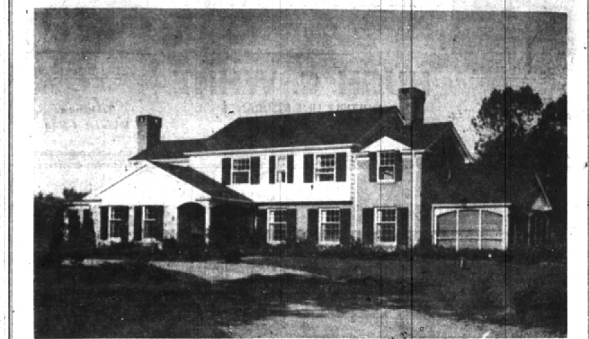
