To Subdivide Estate in Bloomfield

Sale of Westwind Farms, the 250-acre country home of the late Edward A. and Florence Hammond Skate on Orchard Lake Road at Middlebell and Square Lake Roads was revealed this week, along with the news that the land would be subdivided for private residential use by Houseman-Spitzley Corporation.

Francis H. Phelps, president of Houseman-Spitzley Corporation, headed the group of buyers. The selling price was not disclosed. The Farms, which includes all of Hammond Lake and about 3000 feet on Upper Long Lake, at one time was the home of a blue-ribbon winning string of horses that rode under the Westwind Farms colors.

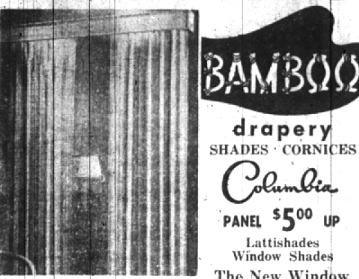
THE PROPERTY was operated as a dairy and produce farm until about 15 years ago. In recent years it has been occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Francis C. Gallaudet and their five children. Mrs. Gallaudet is one of the four children of the late Mr. and Mrs. Skate, who figured in the sale. Others are Edward A. Skate, of Grosse Pointe, the only son; and two other daughters, Mrs. James J. Phelan.

of Grosse Pointe; and Mrs. Robert C. Smith, of Metamora. The property was originally purchased in 1882 by George H. Hammond, father of Florence Hammond Skate. The families have been prominent in the automotive manufacturing field for many years, being associated with General Manufacturing Co., Federal Motor Truck Co., Equipment Manufacturing, Inc., and with ownership of the Hammond Building and Recreation Building in downtown Detroit. Karl F. Meyer and Leslie R. Tripp represented the sellers.

IN DEVELOPING the land for residential use, Phelps revealed that important restrictions will be set up to maintain the property as an attractive suburban area. No motor-driven craft will be permitted on Hammond Lake, and the 1 1/2 miles of sandy beaches surrounding the lake will be preserved. The Hammond Lake area will be developed first. Homes will be well restricted with architects' designs required, he said.

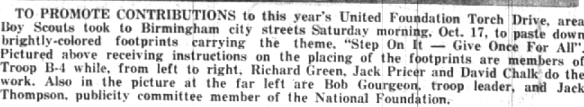

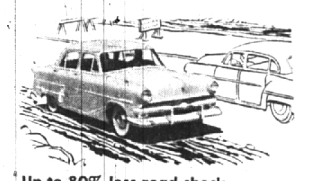

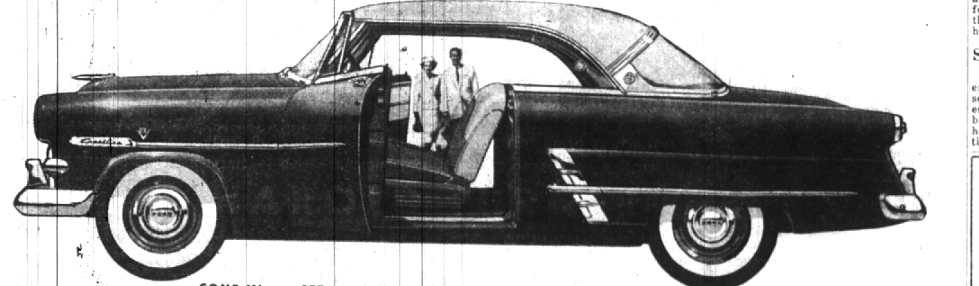
