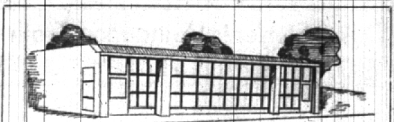

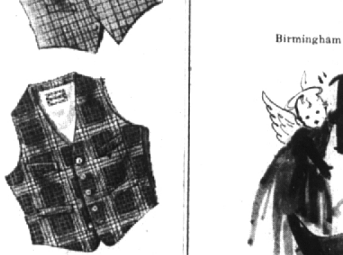

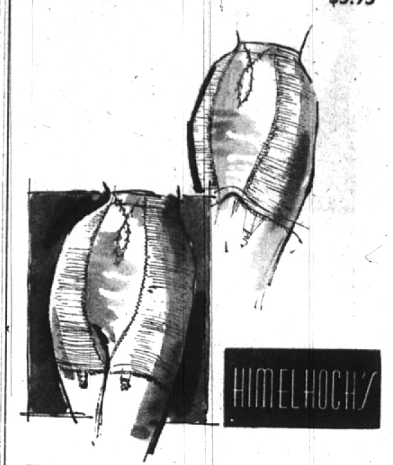
Remembers Very First Eccentric
