Woo Foo Foo, a pheasant fancier who resides at 947 East Seven Mile, pleaded guilty at his arraignment before Justice Alden on charges of possession of and transporting loaded firearms, possession of game out of season and no hunting license.

Foo was fined \$110 and placed on probation for 90 days during which time his guns were ordered held by Troy police.

Police Chief David Grattop arrested Foo with two pheasants in his possession on Sunday, Oct. 15.

**Y-Church Basketball League Will Organize**

An organizational meeting of the Birmingham Y.M.C.A.—Church basketball league has been called for 7 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 5 at the Y.M.C.A. House. This activity is for boys who have not reached their 19th birthday and especially for those not connected with high school varsity or reserve teams.

It is anticipated that a six team league will be formed with First Methodist church defending its championship. Any interested churches are urged to contact the Birmingham Y.M.C.A.

**Combined Refuse Collection Asked**

Possibility of a combined garbage and rubbish pickup at the curb will be studied by city commissioners next month when they receive bids to renew garbage and rubbish pickup bids from private contractors.

The city's department of public works also will submit estimates at the same time of a refuse collection as a municipal operation.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert recommended that the one pickup collection be considered at the time of renewing contracts and that all refuse be placed at the curb to assure the most economical services. This would save the city over \$8,000 a year, Egbert contended.

Commissioners asked that bids contain both the costs of picking up garbage at the rear door as is the present practice and also the costs of picking up garbage at the curb.

**Academy Student Wins First Prize**

First prize for "creative ceramics" was awarded by the Designer-Craftsman, U.S.A. exhibition to Robert Creanen of Cranbrook Academy of Art.

The exhibition, which opened Oct. 22 at Brooklyn Museum in New York, is composed of 242 art pieces selected nationally from over 3,000 works submitted. Several Cranbrook students, in addition to Creanen and Maja Grottel, Cranbrook ceramics instructor, were chosen to show toadies, metalwork, ceramics, furniture, or woodwork.

**Troy Schools Borrow \$50,000 on State Aid**

Budget deficits at Troy township schools will be relieved to the extent of \$50,000, Supt. of Schools Stewart K. Baker announced this week.

Baker said the board of education has completed an agreement to borrow the amount from the Birmingham National Bank, to be repaid by Feb. 1, 1954, when the school system will have received sufficient state aid monies to retire the note.

**EGBERT FURTHERED** that if the city granted this contract to the tractor division, it might also be under pressure to extend a like service for other industries outside of the corporate limits.

Commissioner Dean G. Beier agreed with Egbert's findings and added that the city could not consider it at the present time because of the lack of necessary equipment.

**Two Jailed, Fined By Justice Alden In Assault Cases**

Full terms plus fines were meted out to two assault battery cases brought before Troy township Justice Herbert W. Alden this week.

Joseph D. Cadwallader, 22, of Pontiac pleaded guilty to the charge and was sentenced to jail \$100 and to spend 15 days in Oakland county jail.

Troy police reported that Cadwallader entered a darkened Troy township home at 1:30 a.m. Tuesday and removed his shoes. When asked by the housewife, whom he had awakened, what he was doing there, he explained that he wanted to use the phone. He suddenly changed his mind, struck the woman and fled.

HOWEVER, he returned for his shoes and was held at bay until police arrived by an irate husband armed with a shotgun.

John H. Nance, of Highland Park, was found guilty of assault and battery. Witnesses testified he struck his wife with his fist while they were in the township.

He was fined \$105 and sentenced to serve 30 days in Oakland county jail.
