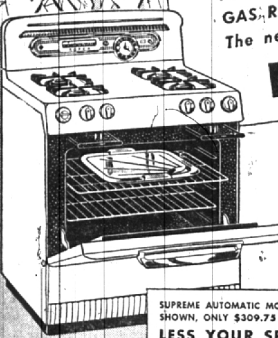
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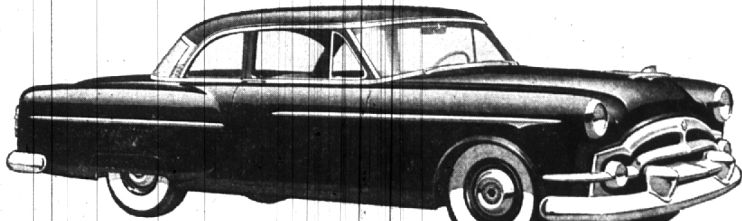

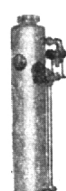
HUNT is known throughout the country as a speaker on business, economic, foreign trade and marketing subjects. He has had a long and distinguished career in business and government.

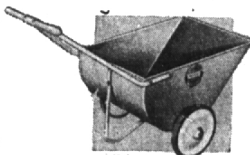

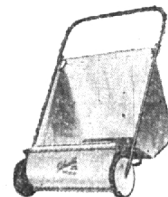
