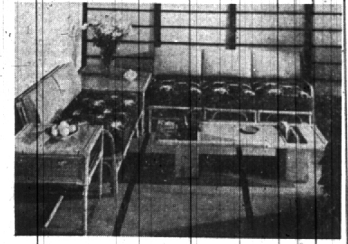

Growth of Area, West Bloomfield Panel's Subject

WALNUT LAKE—The proposed new zoning ordinance was the subject of a panel discussion at the Oct. 20 meeting of the west Bloomfield League of Women Voters. Participating were Supervisor Hiland M. Thatcher, Township Planning Board Chairman Claude Whitmer and members Leo DeConick and Ray Baker. Other members of the board are Mrs. Donald Connor of Orchard Lake, Earl Garrels of Westacres, Verne Barker of Middle Straits Lake and R. Colby of Keego Harbor.

IT WAS BROUGHT OUT that the rapidly growing school population in the township will put an increasing tax burden on residential property since there is, at present, very little manufacturing in West Bloomfield township. Controlled industrial zoning would provide tax relief for the homeowner without admitting objectionable industry. Many small manufacturing plants are attractive in appearance and clean in operation. Also mentioned at the meeting was Walnut Lake's trailer case.

TAKEN TO THE higher courts, which upheld the prohibition of trailers in an area zoned for single dwellings, this has served as a case for other townships.
