of the auditorium so that by using one half of the gymnasium, 1200 persons may be seated for viewing plays, graduations, etc.

Froster announced that present plans for elementary enrollment increases include restoring Vaughan school to elementary use.

He said special activity areas such as the gymnasium, conference rooms, teachers' lounge, and presently divided classrooms will be restored for their present use as classrooms to their original purposes. Thus, he said, only six additional classrooms will be available for elementary use at Vaughan school when the high school is moved out.

"This results in the need for from four to six elementary classrooms to be built now. The board at present is investigating the possibility of making these additions to the Wing Lake school."

REFERENCE TO a possible Wing Lake addition touched off a lively debate between members of the board and the audience.

One spectator produced a newspaper editorial by John S. Knight that championed large schools such as Vaughan, from the standpoint of economy and facilities. A lady spectator offered a research report that indicated that elementary schools should be small and located not too far from the student's home, such as Wing Lake.

Lee and Board Trustee Mrs. Irving MacKenzie participated in a brief exchange with Mrs. MacKenzie hinting that an addition to Vaughan school would be more appropriate than one at Wing Lake.

A spectator protested that Vaughan school facilities already
