Mrs. Kehe was touring the eastern half of the continent for the purpose of observing women's activities and American educational methods.

Altrusa International, Inc., with a membership in July, 1953, of 11,249, comprising 349 clubs in eight countries, is the foremost national organization of executive and professional women, either classified or unclassified, having been organized and incorporated in 1917.

The Altrusa Club of Birmingham was hailed by the convention as a pioneer in a new contribution to the international understanding, having been, in this case, the first member of the parent organization to cooperate with the United States Department of State in its program of entertaining exchange visitors from foreign countries.
