**Troy Schools Face Deficit Of \$77,000**

Troy township schools face an operating deficit of \$77,000 between now and January, Stuart K. Baker, superintendent of Troy schools told the school board at its meeting Tuesday night.

Estimated budget needs were set at \$190,000 from now to Jan. 1, while estimated income comes to only \$113,000. "The shortage of funds is such that we may have difficulty in meeting teachers' payrolls by the end of October unless something is done about it," said Baker.

He added that three possibilities exist to ease the situation: the schools may seek an advance on anticipated state aid, they may borrow from a bank on anticipated state aid, or they may borrow on tax anticipation.

ELMER LOWE, board treasurer, said he felt the best course would be to seek an advance in state aid since no interest would have to be paid. The board then adopted a motion that \$80,000 be borrowed and applied for and that the remaining possibilities for borrowing should be applied for and the results of the application for an advance in state aid could be determined.

Baker stated that with the state facing financial difficulties, it is improbable that the Troy schools will get a sufficient advance to see them through.

Baker also stated that the financial picture of the schools should be much improved after the first of the year when two-thirds of the income for school operation will start coming in.

Under pressure from area residents, city officials withdrew their petition asking for a change from agricultural to industrial along Maple, with single family immediately north.
