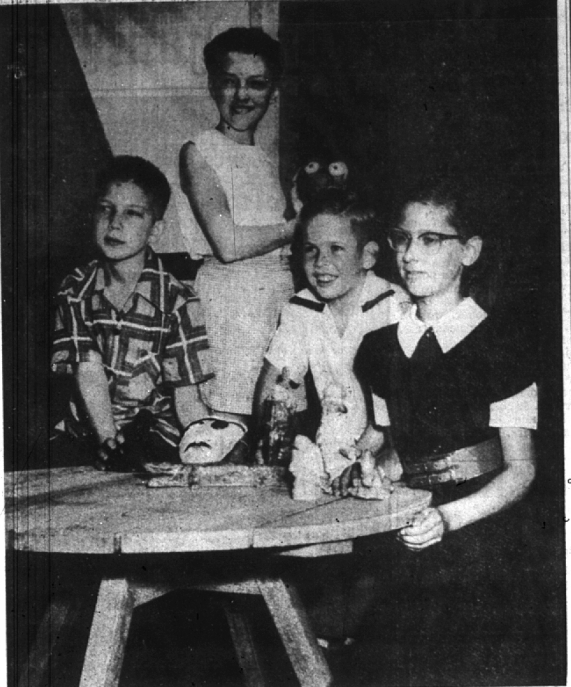

Children learn to use the potter's wheel, build by the coil and slab method, overglaze, underglaze and slip decorating, how to make and apply glazes, and stacking and firing a kiln.

Adelle and Carl Toepfer will assist in teaching the classes this year. They are junior and senior high school students and have been making pottery on the wheel and by hand for eight years. They also teach classes at the Y.W.A. During the semester, the children are taken on trips to nearby sculptors' studios and exhibits, in addition to their classes on pottery.
