**NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS**

On August 3, 1953, the City Commission held a public hearing for the purpose of considering an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance, regulating the density of residential construction in areas zoned for business.

At that time, the City Commission felt that although legal notice of the hearing had been given by publication in the Birmingham Eccentric, that there may not have been sufficient publicity and continued the hearing until Monday, September 22, 1953.

The proposed amendment would limit residential development in business zones to that which is permitted in the income business district and would prohibit residential use in the industrial zone except for a detached and his family.

Copies of the amendment as proposed are available from the Planning Director. The amendment was recommended by the Planning Board for the reason that high density residential development now permitted in the existing zoning ordinance on business and industrial zones cannot be adequately served.

The Commission would be interested in your comments concerning the amendment and you are cordially invited to attend the hearing on September 22, 1953.

## Cranbrook Publication Honors Outstanding Botanist of Michigan

A Michigan botanist who gave new names to 1,300 plants and published over 155 scientific papers has been commemorated in a bulletin recently published by Cranbrook Institute of Science.

Entitled "Farwelliana," the study deals with the life and botanical work of the late Oliver Atkins Farwell, who conducted his field research principally in the counties of Monroe, Wayne, Washtenaw, Oakland and Macomb in the south, and in Houghton and Keweenaw counties in the Upper Peninsula.

During 41 years service with

Parke, Davis and Company, Farwell built up an important botanical collection for checking identification of plants used in drug manufacture. This collection was later presented to the University of Michigan, and Dale J. Hagenah of the herbarium committee of Cranbrook Institute of Science.

The Farwell biography is followed by an annotated list of the plants first discovered by him, a listing of all his plant names not covered by the standard indexes, and a complete bibliography.

The publication was prepared

by Drs. Rogers McVaugh and Stanley Cain of the University of Michigan, and Dale J. Hagenah of the herbarium committee of Cranbrook Institute of Science.

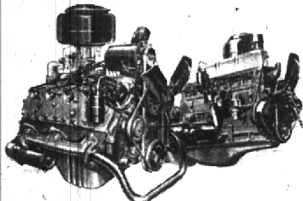
