Birmingham's Junior League is planning its third session of Vision Screening for pre-school children from 3 to 5 years.

Beginning Sept. 29, tests will be given each Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9:30 to noon at the Community House. The tests will continue through Oct. 9.

Mrs. Edward Wilson, speaking for the League, stressed again that there are no fees and no advance registration is necessary.

"The plan, backed by local and state health and educational authorities," Mrs. Wilson said, "is for any child in this age bracket residing within the Birmingham area. Poor vision, at this age, is hard to detect because children are not working at close range projects.

"In addition to the local and state bodies, we are working in cooperation with the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness."

Mrs. Harvey A. Kresge, Jr., and Mrs. Gene A. White, managers of last spring's tests, will again be in charge.

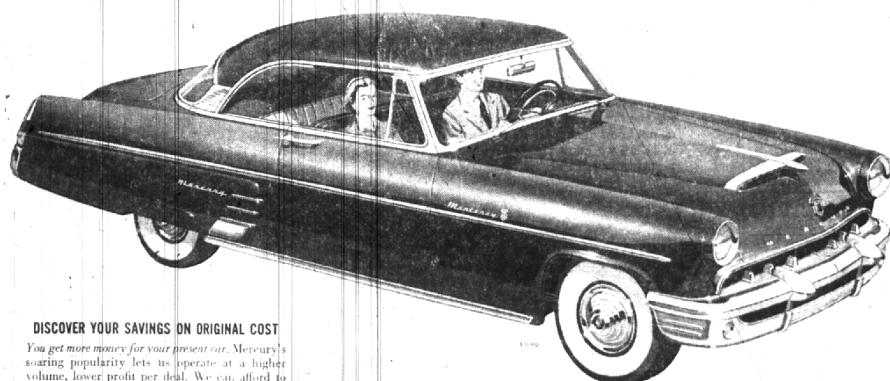
