"The phone book is divided among them, with each woman making a certain number of calls," she said. "In this manner we feel we will miss no potential donor and will be able to make this bank a successful one."

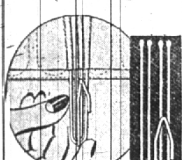
