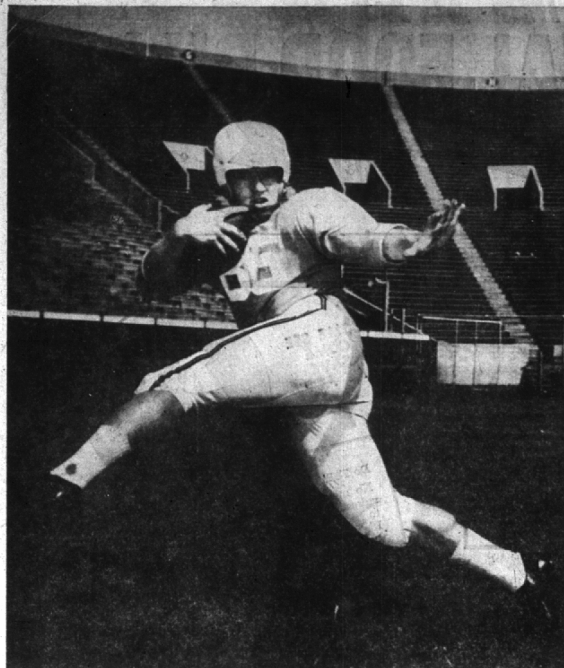

**Submit Solution  
 To Drain Problem  
 On Troy Property**

Efforts to get construction of the Pembroke elementary school underway and to begin the development of a residential area northwest of the city in Troy township were given a shot in the arm Monday night by the city.

Competition was given in the arm Monday night by the city. Anxious school officials called a meeting of property owners and officials of Troy township and Birmingham last week to determine what methods could be taken to serve the area with sanitary sewers, water and storm water sewers.

Arthur Nechman, developer of the Troy property, sought city facilities before beginning work on his subdivision. The services were denied by Birmingham because of possible water shortages within the city and inadequate storm sewers.

CITY MANAGER Donald C. Echert's recommendations to the city commission to allow the sanitary sewers to tie into Birmingham sewers, draining into the South Oakland County Sewage Disposal District, providing a storm sewer was constructed from the property to the Coalidge sewer, were approved. Echert further recommended that the storm sewer be designed to serve all of Nechman's property, the school site, a site for a Presbyterian church and pavement drainage areas.

Commissioners agreed that the city would not participate in any costs of facilities within the area. Still a problem to the developer will be a water supply.

The proposal authorized by commissioners for further negotiations with property owners and Troy township officials is similar to a plan submitted by the city in June of this year.

In summing up the feelings of the commission, Commissioner Lance C. Minor said, "I think we should help the board of education but let the developer solve his own problems."

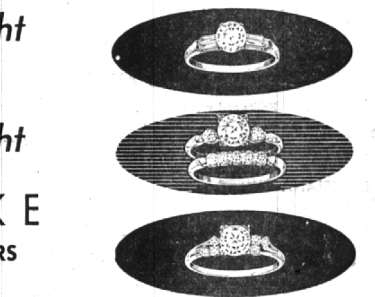

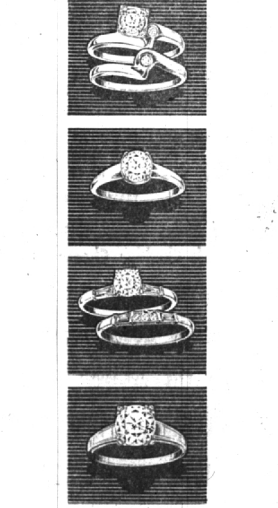
