On a large map of Oakland county each supervisor and his respective committee assignments will be represented by a Christmas tree light. It is expected that an exhibit of county road machinery will be held outside the high school parking lot.

THE COUNTY sheriff's office will have an exhibit of guns and equipment used in the county in keeping law and order. Curb Ordinance Amended By City

An amendment to the curb ordinance to allow additional curb cuts when two or more parcels of land are under one occupancy has been approved by the city commission. Commissioners had instructed City Attorney Forbes Haskell to prepare an ordinance amendment that would permit the city to give the strict wording of the original ordinance when the law was shown to create a hardship.

REVIEW OF the ordinance was prompted when Shell Oil company petitioned for permission to cut a second driveway from West Maple on property the firm had recently leased. City engineers denied the request in following terms of the ordinance that restrict the number of curb cuts in property under one ownership. Commissioners will discuss the width of curb cuts at a later date.
