Services for Constance Coulter English, 27, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clark Coulter, former Birmingham residents, were held Wednesday afternoon at Urbana, Ohio.

Mrs. English, now of Cable, Ohio, was killed Sunday evening in a head-on crash just south of Mt. Pleasant. Her husband, Charles English, was seriously injured in the crash and was flown from the Mt. Pleasant Community hospital for the private services held from the home of his father, Edwin L. English.

Constance Coulter was born in Birmingham and attended the local schools. She was graduated from Baldwin high school in 1945, vice president of her class. Always active in school affairs, she was one of the most popular students in the area. She was a member of the First Presbyterian church.

Besides her husband and parents, she is survived by one child and two brothers, James and Donald Coulter.

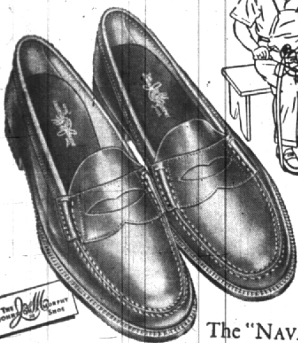

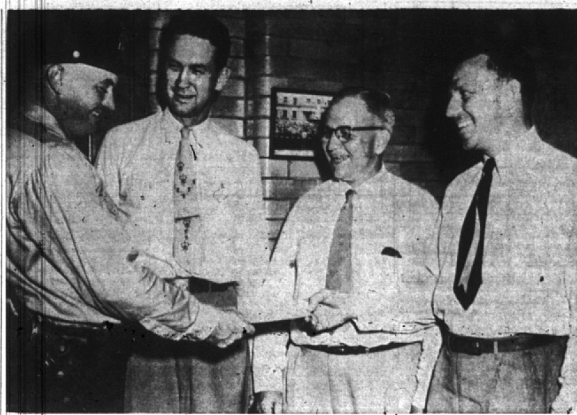

## B'ham Officer Selected for Training Award

Birmingham Patrolman Milton Jones has been selected as the winner of the Detroit Traffic Safety Association's third annual training award for 1953.

The award was presented to Jones in the Birmingham police station Monday afternoon by Walt Pletcher, secretary of the training award board of judges.

It consists of a \$350 scholarship to a three-week police traffic training course at Northwestern University's Police Academy.

Tuition, books, room and board, supplies and transportation will be covered by the scholarship.

Jones will attend the course from September 14 through October 2. He will then return to the department.

## New Cranbrook Course Gets Underway Sept. 9

Field trips for the observation of birds, insects, plants, minerals and fossils will be planned at the registration meeting of the course in nature study at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 9, at Cranbrook Institute of Science.

## Pair Arrested Following Holdup Of Gas Station

Excellent teamwork between citizens and law enforcement agencies of Oakland county and Detroit resulted in the arrest of two bandits sought in the early Tuesday morning hold-up of a Bloomfield township gas station.

Arrested by Detroit police a few hours after the \$110 holdup of a service station at Telegraph and Maple were George Lane, 26, and Floyd Lampela, 27, both of Detroit.

Detroit detectives said Wednesday the pair had confessed to both the Bloomfield robbery and an attempted robbery of another service station at James Couzens and Curtis in Detroit.

The two men, posing as hitchhikers, entered the station on Telegraph shortly before closing time. They loitered in the station for over an hour before drawing a knife on Harold Toft, 30, station attendant. They then tied Toft and forced him into a small room.

THEY WAITED on two customers while they ransacked cash drawers and forced open a steel cabinet. A truck driver observed them leaving the station in a distinctly marked 1952 Yellow Ford convertible.

The description of their car, plus personal descriptions furnished by Toft, were flashed over the police teletype.

A Detroit patrolman in a squad car thought the descriptions fitted Lane, who had frequently been patronized by Lane shortly resulting in the arrest of the two men.

POLICE STATED that some of the loot from the Telegraph robbery was found in the suspects' apartment after their arrest. They were scheduled to be turned over to the Oakland county sheriff's department Wednesday afternoon.
