### Birmingham Artist Gets Award for Watercolor

The view out of his studio window was the subject of Fred Simper's prizewinning watercolor "Summer Woods." The award was made for his entry in the Kirk-of-the-Hills Outdoor Art Festival held last week.

Simper has been a resident at 3075 Spring road for the past three years, with his wife and three children. When not painting for pleasure at his home studio, he is doing commercial Dow Chemical advertising at McManus, John and Adams studio.

Still life, landscape and imagination form the basis of Simper's paintings, which are watercolor only. He had no advance

training in art, believing for himself that experience is the best teacher. "If the ability and talent are there," says the artist, "no amount of book work will improve it." He feels he wants to keep his own technique and develop it, rather than learn someone else's style of painting.

An award winner ten times in the Michigan Artists show since 1941, Simper has exhibited also at the Indiana Artists exhibition and in Chicago, New York and Washington.

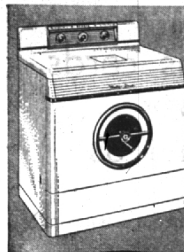

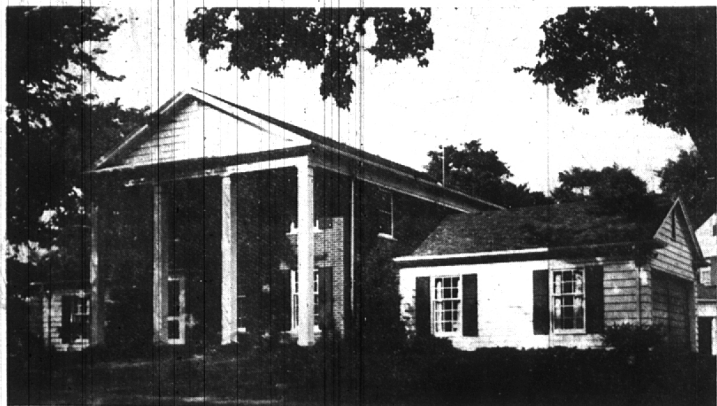

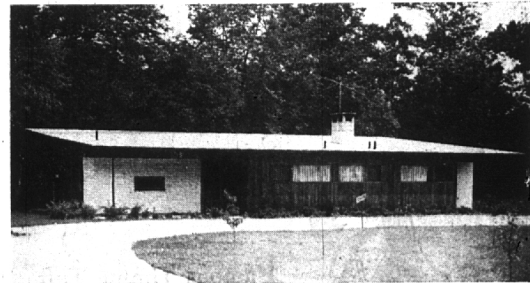
