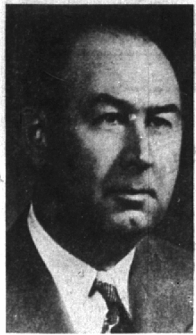

West Side Fire Station Location Deemed Necessity

The Oakland County Circuit last Thursday morning determined that a necessity existed in the City of Birmingham's land condemnation suit for the west side fire station and found no grounds for damages. The case, earlier scheduled for Friday, March 19, was postponed. No property owner appeared to protest the action. Circuit Court Judge George B. Hartwick heard the case in which the city sought to condemn subdivision restrictions in the Quarton Lakes Estates subdivision to construct a fire station at the corner of West Maple and Chestersfield. Construction of the station now awaits decision of city voters who will vote on the fire hall bonding proposal in Monday's city election.

Lathrup Approves Road Repairing

An emergency road repairing program for the spring months was approved in a special meeting Saturday morning by Lathrup Village city councilmen. Councilmen instructed City Administrator Leonard Watchowski to enter into a contract with the Wolverine Asphalt company to lay gravel and grade streets in the city at a cost not to exceed \$6,040 with a provision that the city be returned any surplus funds should the road program be completed at a lesser charge. Previously, Mayor William H. Harvie explained that this program was a repair program to keep streets open in the city during the spring thaw.
