### County's Newest Radio 'Ham' Is Red Cross Group

The area's newest radio "ham" appears to be the American Red Cross of Oakland county. It's new short wave radio station has been installed in the chapter home, 118 Franklin road, Pontiac.

The station is a memorial to the late Leon M. See, a member of the Oakland County Radio club, and was installed by club members Harold A. Bird, Waterford, president, said the club and the Red Cross would buy the transmitter. The new system will give chapter offices instant contact with the Pontiac police department and about 150 short wave equipped cars owned by the Oakland and Catalpa Radio clubs' members.

"WERE GRATEFUL beyond words," Harold B. Euler, chapter chairman said. "This almost instantaneous communication from our headquarters can mean a great deal if a bad storm, enemy attack or other extensive damage disaster should strike our area."  
Bird, speaking for the Radio club, said they wanted to have a memorial to Mr. See, and with Federal Communications Commission approval were able to transfer his call letters, W-8-TNO, to the Red Cross.

HE ADDED that club members would run periodic drills to make sure the 60-watt transmitter is operating satisfactorily at all times.  
Bird, who is Red Cross emergency communications chairman, is trustee of the Radio club's two short wave sending stations at the Pontiac airport.

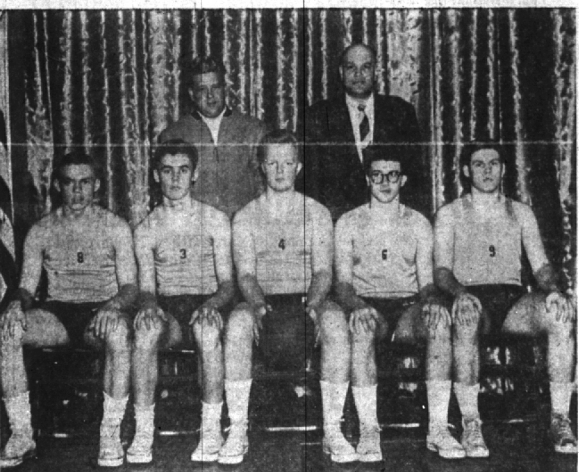
