**Operation Polio Awaits Vaccine Supply's Arrival**

With a temporary headquarters already established, work goes on now to recruit the many volunteers who will be needed to administer the polio vaccine tests in Oakland county.

The special office has been set up at the Oakland County Nurses home, 1025 N. Telegraph, Pontiac. The entire second floor will be devoted to this program, operating Mondays through Saturdays from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., until tests are completed.

Mrs. Howard Riemann of Birmingham has been named general volunteer chairman and is still asking registered nurses to offer their services to administer the "shots."

Other special committees named last week will be headed by Mrs. Russell Hutter, Pontiac; and Mrs. Samuel B. Danto, Huntington Woods, for headquarters services.

TRANSPORTATION of supplies and materials will be handled by Mrs. Jack Hale, general chairman, Pontiac; and Mrs. Erwin Bell, South Oakland county; public information, Mrs. Harold Jacober, Pontiac; Mrs. Zyrund J. Siparko, Royal Oak.

Public educational promotion will be in the hands of Mrs. Arthur Albright, general chairman, with Mrs. Ralph Folkenroth and Mrs. Stanley Watson, assisting.

General chairman of school volunteer committees is Mrs. James Lillie, assisted by Mrs. Albert Marcova, Mrs. Zyrund J. Siparko and Mrs. Joseph DeVriendt.

MRS RIEMANN pointed out the need for more volunteers, especially registered nurses and nurses aides. She asked that anyone who can devote a few hours a week contact Mrs. J. F. Waiser, Pontiac; Mrs. H. Rodriguez, Royal Oak; Mrs. Bradlee Frazier, Birmingham, or Mrs. Henry Madigan, Wixom.

Throughout the county there will be some 35,000 children in the first three grades who will receive these test shots. Mrs. Riemann said there probably would be over 6,000 in Birmingham from public, private and parochial schools.

LITERATURE is being sent to parents this week through county schools, informing them of the Dr.

Jonas E. Salk vaccine, which it is hoped will provide life-long immunity to polio.

Schools will be headquarters for the "shots," Mrs. Riemann explained, adding that parental consent was necessary before a child could receive the treatment.

With the progress being made in recruitments and other details, it is hoped that the program will swing into action as soon as the vaccine is received at Pontiac headquarters.

James Reeder and Carson James will represent Birmingham high school at the State Hi-Y Conference, April 2, 3, and 4 at Dearborn. The theme of the conference, which will attract 400 boys from all parts of the state, is "Living in Home, School and Community."

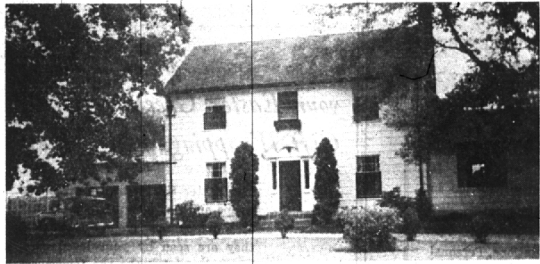

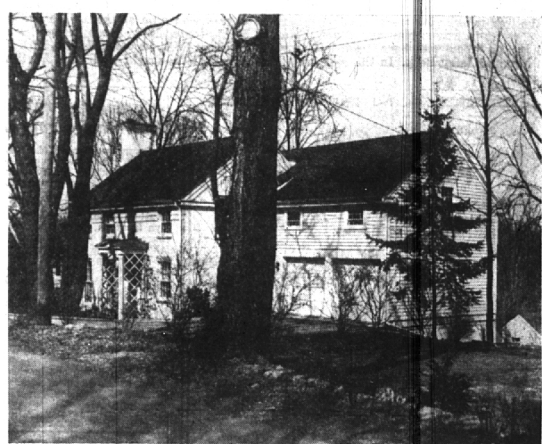
