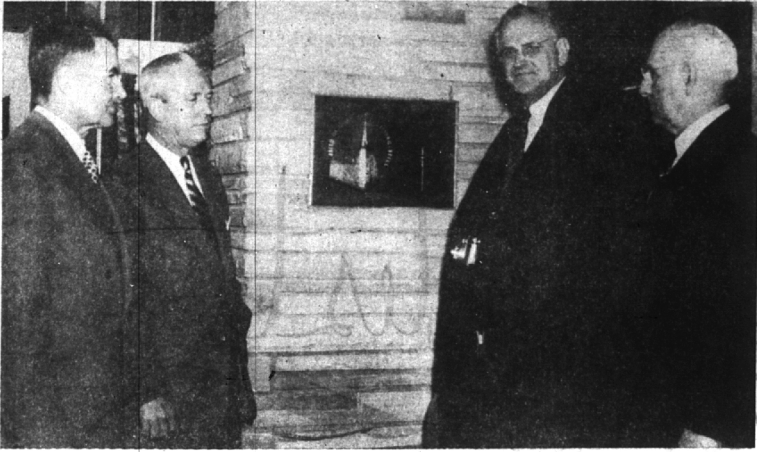


What the Church of Your Choice is Doing

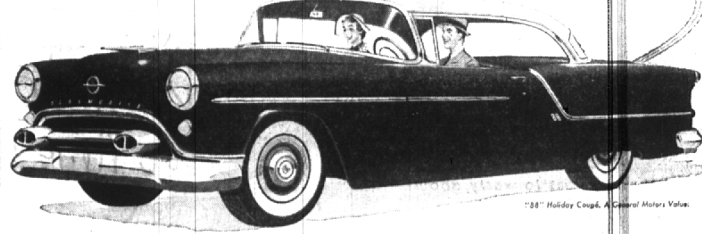
