### Wins Scholarship For Studies at British College

One of the final Marshall Scholarship Award winners is C. Thoburn Maxwell II, 22-year-old son of Mrs. C. Thoburn Maxwell, 6294 Worthington, Wing Lake, it has been announced in London, England.

The award will enable Maxwell to continue his studies in Oriental history at St. John's College, Oxford.

Maxwell said Tuesday that he will leave for Oxford aboard the liner Queen Elizabeth on Sept. 29, and will enroll at the college in October.

**AN ALUMNUS** of Cranbrook, Maxwell was graduated from Princeton in June, 1953. He presently is doing graduate work in Arabic history at the University of Michigan.

"I am delighted to have received the award since it will give me an opportunity to continue my studies at Oxford where ancient Arabic manuscripts are available. I have

been studying the Arabic language for two years in hopes of studying the manuscripts, many of which have not been translated to English," said Maxwell.

Maxwell was chosen for the award by the Marshall Aid Commemoration Commission in London, which is the final arbiter of the candidates selected by regional committees in this country for scholarships at British Universities.

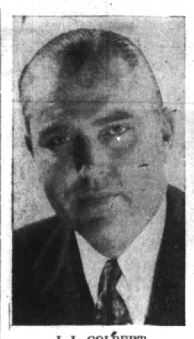
While the trips are limited to Junior Members over eleven years old, Institute membership is open to the public at a nominal fee.

### Colbert To Head Jun. Ach. Banquet

L. L. Colbert, Martel road, Bloomfield, H-1114, president of Chrysler Corporation, is general chairman for the fourth annual "Future Unlimited" banquet of Junior Achievement of Southeastern Michigan, to be held May 13 at Detroit's Masonic Temple.

Announcement of Colbert's chairmanship was made today by J. C. Doyle, president of J. A. and sales and advertising manager of Ford Motor Co.

Doyle said that 3,200 business and industrial leaders and Junior Achievers will be attending the banquet. "This makes it one of the largest, as well as one of the finest events of its kind in Southeastern Michigan," he said.

"Future Unlimited" marks the end of the business year for 3,000 Southeastern Michigan boys and girls who have been operating 188 J. A. firms. As chairman, Colbert will preside over the presentation of awards and college scholarships to outstanding teenagers in the program, and awards to J. A. firms that have won local and national honors for their operations.

### Fire Losses Swing Upward During March

Fire losses in Birmingham for March were the highest for a single month so far this year, Fire Chief Vern W. Griffith's report shows.

Total losses in March were estimated at \$2,235. Losses in February were set at \$150 while in January they were estimated at \$578.

The department was called out to investigate 41 reports of fire during March. Other runs were: four for suspected gas, eight miscellaneous and seven for first aid, for a total of 60 runs.

A study of March figures shows estimated damage to buildings was \$1,125 and damage to contents \$1,100. Total value of buildings endangered by fire was \$832,250.

In two out of 272 investigations by the fire prevention bureau, unsafe conditions were noted.

Department trucks travelled 171 miles to the scenes of fires and 1,478 gallons of water were pumped.
