Townsite Community

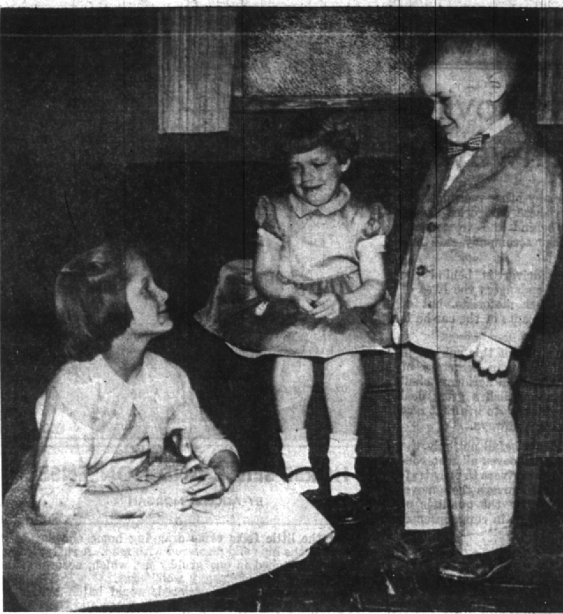
