How the city will assess the costs of paving Chesterfield for better than 100 feet north of W. Maple is expected to be decided next Monday night. Haack will Monday and could not attend the regular hearing. Haack originally proposed that the assessment follow city policy of having corner business property stand the side street paving cost. Residents of Franklin, Wing Lake-Foxcroft and Walnut Lake are again asked to contribute to the Inter-Lakes blood bank on Tuesday, May 18, at West Bloomfield Township hall, 4400 Orchard Lake road, from 2-5 and 6-8 p.m. Cooperating with the Inter-Lakes bank on the event will be Keigo Harbor and Westacres, and the Lawrence A. Sims Post of Walnut Lake. Each will recruit donors within its area. The Inter-Lakes bank will cover the Mayfair telephone exchange. Organizations in the area are cooperating in the bloodmobile visit. The Martha Circle of the Orchard Lake Community church will serve supper for Red Cross workers. The Walnut Lake Women's club will bake the cookies for the canteen, in charge of Walnut Lake residents.

ESTABLISHED last fall to serve area residents and supply blood for the armed forces, the Inter-Lakes bank collected 89 pints on the October drive. Since then, residents, have had blood available for transfusions. Mrs. O. S. Koskinen of Bloomfield Glen drive, district recreation chairman, arranges for the release of blood to a hospital when needed by a resident of the area. Mrs. Dalton Sifton of Bloomfield Lane, volunteer Red Cross worker, states that blood is badly needed at the present time to replace the large amounts used in the late winter months.


