Students in William Merrill's classes at Will-O-Way theater have elected officers for their recently formed winter stock company.

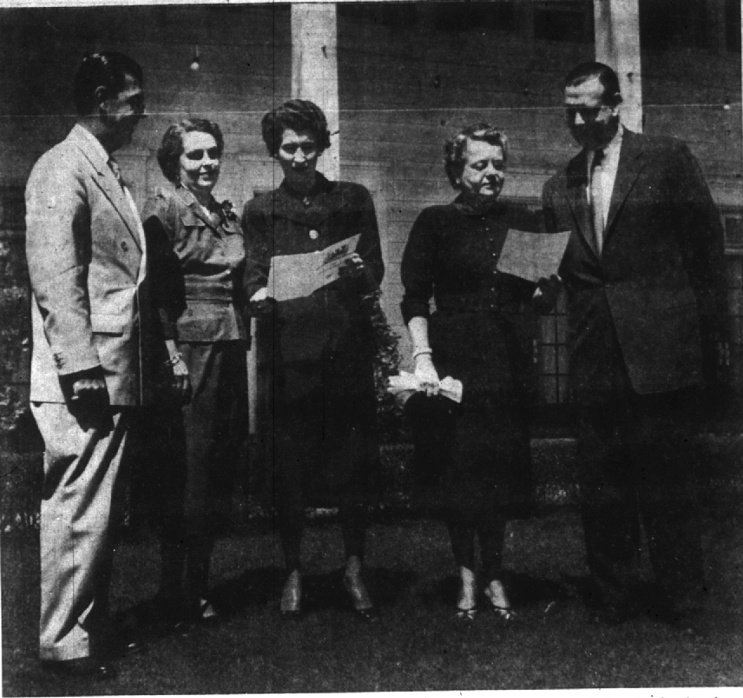
Treese Sikorski, will head the group as president with Betty Beck, vice president; Gail Engel, secretary and Arnold Lunmark, treasurer.
