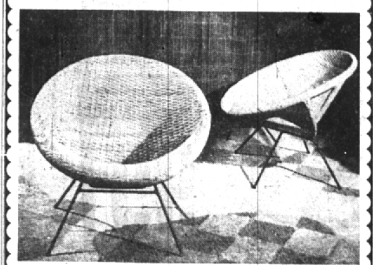
of Rochester, N. Y., and Paul D. Mullin of Salisbury, Pa.

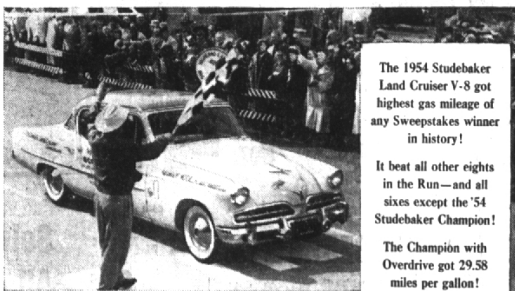
