The township still is considering a possible contract with the City of Birmingham for continued use of the city's disposal plant, erecting its own sewage disposal plant or joining all communities in the area for the construction of an interceptor sewer to the City of Detroit. Bloomfield Hills, it was revealed, is studying the feasibility of an ordinance to require each home and business in the city take care of its own disposal problem and close any outlets into the Rouge river.

Possible fate of the interceptor sewer seems to lie with the action taken by Southfield township. Area representatives believe the interceptor will serve a much larger potential population in Southfield than in any other area locally.

Area's Sewage Disposal Report Is Due May 27

Representative members of five neighboring communities last Thursday decided to hold one more meeting and discuss final plans for their individual area's sewage disposal problems before the May 27 meeting of the Water Resources Commission.

The study group, composed of representatives of Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, and Southfield and Troy townships, has been meeting in an attempt to answer the sewage pollution question in this area.

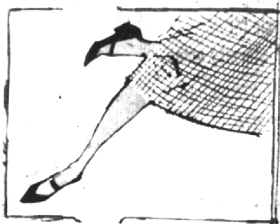
All but Troy township now are under citation by the Water Resources board and must have final plans on abatement of River Rouge pollution in the hands of the commission by the May 27 deadline.

Birmingham's plans already have been drawn and approved by city commissioners. The city seeks to meet standards required by Water Resources officials first and then help neighboring areas if at all possible.

THE CITY stands in the best light of all five, having its own sewage disposal plant in operation and has already taken steps to improve facilities at the city plant to meet state standards.

The City of Bloomfield Hills and the townships of Southfield and Bloomfield are facing a much tougher problem of solution.

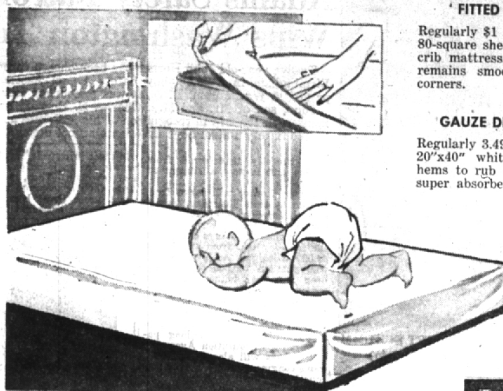

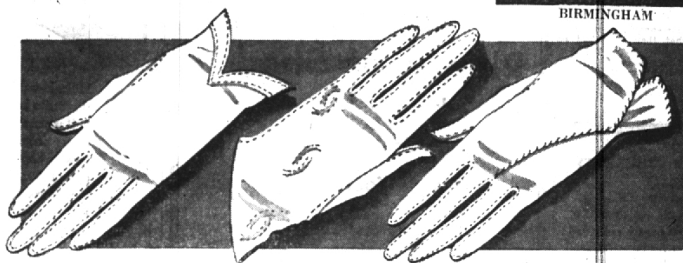
