Robert W. Englehart of Bloomfield Hills, trustee of Denison university at Granville, Ohio, will speak at the first annual buffet

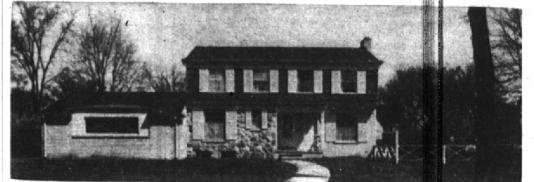

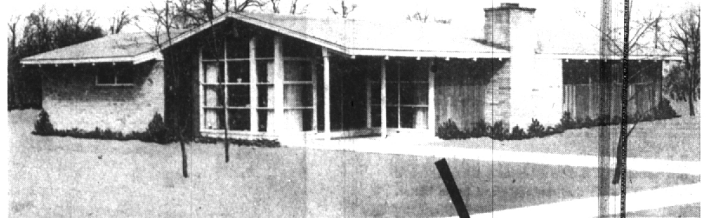

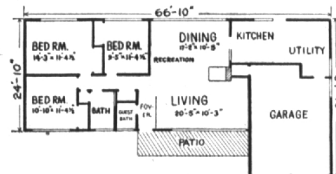
