Attention new home owners: The Bloomfield Township Fire Department services carbon tetrachloride, soda and acid and foamite extinguishers. For other types, the department recommends the Donald Kerr Fire Service, 5900 M 59 Highway, (near the Pontiac airport).
For over-all fire coverage, the fire department advises keeping two extinguishers in the home. The CO2 (carbon dioxide) extinguisher for small fires involving paper, grease, inflammable liquids and anything electrical and the soda acid extinguisher for deep-seated fires in wood or upholstery, etc.

For those households desiring only one extinguisher, the State Fire Marshal recommends the CO2 because resembling snow in liquid form when in use, it isn't messy or harmful in any way to furniture or textiles.
If there are enough calls from this area, Donald Kerr states that he will service your extinguishers in your home instead of the usual method of doing it at his office. He has also offered to demonstrate the various types of extinguishers
