### 'Come as You Are' Block Party Is Held

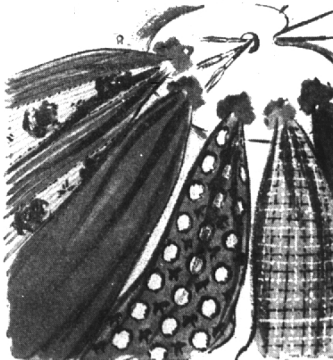
