4. You can cultivate gardens pretty soon. For Pete's sake be careful of tips of lilles, tulips, daffodils, etc., which may be barely under the surface. A lot of effort and time has been spent in getting the tips that far.

6. If you notice some impatient hollyfocks, delphinium or phlox beginning to grow, sock the old BORDEAUX to 'em, or SULPHUR or a proper PROPRIETARY.

7. SPECIAL for gushers. We feel it is very selfish to keep the ½ inch rubber hose just for ourselves (especially as we have no use for it) so we are selling it off at 20c A FOOT. (Landscapers and golf courses may not participate in this.)

8. Finish pruning of roses as soon as possible. Prune lightly fod a profusion of blooms — prune heavily for particularly fine blooms. (Be sure rod know what you're doing. It helps.)

9. For covering up unsightly places, cause "like out-houses and fences" unquote (and we might add barns, manure ples, stumps, etc.) here are a number of fast growing vines:
