City \$1,700 Low On '54 Red Cross

Announcing receipts of \$10,781.49 for Birmingham against its quota of \$12,500, Red Cross officials this week said they felt confident the goal would be reached. "There are quite a few contacts to be made yet as vacationers return from the south," a spokesman said, "and there is no doubt in our mind that we will go over the top again."

In the Franklin area \$1,648 of the \$3,000 goal had been reached, while Southfield had topped its \$2,000 quota by \$308.24. In releasing a figure of \$2,747 from the Bloomfield Hills area, the Pontiac office of the Oakland county Red Cross chapter pointed out that this figure could not be construed as accurate.

"The complete total has not been reported to us as yet, but we know it will greatly exceed the returns already registered at our office."

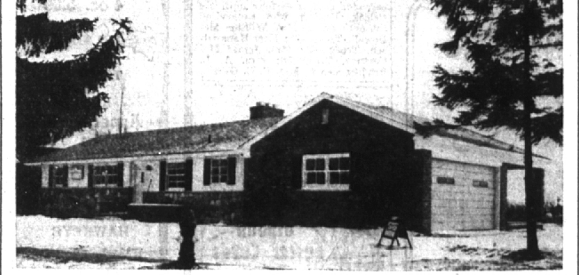


