

Signed for Featured Role In Movie, 'Mister Roberts'

Jim Moloney, son of Dr. and Mrs. James C. Moloney, 414 Arlington, has been signed by John Ford, leading Hollywood film producer and director, for a featured role in "Mister Roberts", based upon the Broadway stage success.

Moloney leaves Hollywood soon for Midway Island in the Pacific, where most of the picture will be shot. Interiors will be filmed in the Hollywood studios of Columbia Pictures, which will release the production.

MOLONEY RECENTLY PLAYED an important part in the John Ford picture, "The Long Grey Line", which was filmed largely on location at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. Later, he played a top role in the Columbia production, "Bugles Wake".

Moloney is a native of Detroit and is a graduate of Wayne University, where his father, a professor of psychoanalytical psychiatry, teaches.

After appearing in stage productions in the East, he made his film debut in Hollywood in 1951 in "Wait Till the Sun Shines, Nellie". He also has appeared in such film productions as "Bells on Their Toes", "Jumping Jacks" and "Fearless Fagin".
