
Class of '03

Hill school was just "the school house" in 1903 and the entire high school class numbering about 75 students was housed on the second floor.

J. Bird Field was superintendent of the school and also high school teacher. Only three teachers were necessary to handle the high school teaching schedule—the other two were Grace L. Smith, the preceptress, and her assistant, Zilpha Campbell.

There were 23 members of the 1903 graduating class and of these Marion R. Glize (Mrs. Harry Allen), Vina Purdy (Mrs. Vina Bell), Mary Wallace (Mrs. Malcolm MacDonald) and Harold Corson still are residents of Birmingham.

The high school prepared the student for the University of Michigan and being on "the diploma list", the student could enter the university without further examination.

Want Blood Bank Sponsors to Set Donor Dates Now

Oakland county businesses, clubs or other groups which plan to sponsor a blood bank prior to July 1, 1955, are asked to make their plans known to Pontiac or Royal Oak officials before Aug. 31.

Dr. E. W. Bauer, county blood chairman, said today that an all-out effort was being made to organize as many blood banks as possible without further delay.

"The Detroit center is giving Oakland county top priority on all Monday and Tuesday bloodmobile calls," he said. "To enable us to set up a long range program, we should have notice of sponsors now so favorable dates may be arranged."

DR. BAUER said the county Red Cross would try to collect 100,000 pints of blood by the 1955 date, 3,000 for defense, the rest for civilian use.

Mrs. Dalton F. Sifton of Southfield township will map out south Oakland visits on Aug. 27, he stated.

"In addition to setting up this advance program, we can always set dates for groups who call in later," Dr. Bauer declared. "We want to set certain dates we can count on."

"Later dates can be arranged so we will be able to keep an even flow of blood into the center. This will help avoid a 'blood drought' like the one we are in today," the doctor concluded.
