## Presbyterians Plan **Building** of Second Church in Vicinity

Plans for the construction of a Presbyterian church to serve the northeast area have taken their major forward step, with a possible fall starting date for the building of

step, with a possible fall starting date for the building of the first unit.

The Rev. Mac Taylor, assigned as pastor of the new church, said this week that a survey would be made, probably Sept. 29, of the 700 families which constitute the area bounded by the Grand Trunk lines, Derby, Coolidge and Maple.

The survey will be made mostly by the Men's club of the First Presbyterian church." Mr. Taylor said, "and should give us a perfect picture of what potentials we have there now.

"THE CONSENSUS is that the area is growing rapidly and that there is already a need for another church there. Mr. Taylor said the first unit will probably cost about \$50,000, with funds coming from the Presbytery church expansion funds. The original tract of 20 acres has been cut to six acres, the remaining land being sold to defray costs of extending utilities to the property.

"AT THE present moment," he said, "I am a pastor without a church. However, we are looking for some location for temporary services which may start as Sunday school classes only. In the meantime, I am able to devote my entire time to working on the new building and making myself acquainted with the people in the area."
