Garstecki Urges Prompt Action On Inspectors

FRANKLIN—The village council faced the problem at Aug. 9 meeting of obtaining complete inspection of buildings under construction within its corporate limits.

Building Inspector J. J. Garstecki said in his opinion, there should be little delay in securing the services of inspectors to handle the electrical and plumbing checks.

He explained he had contacted inspectors in other areas and that Franklin could, if necessary, get the help of the Farmington men, although it could not be a permanent arrangement.

He introduced Southfield township's former building inspector, C. O. Laidlaw and said he might consider taking the office.

LADLAW discussed the many phases of the post, its importance in the future development of the area, and how best to handle the job.

In a discussion of specialized inspections with Trustee Harry Rotter, Laidlaw said he was a civil engineer and qualified to handle structural inspections. He admitted that under legal standards, he would not be able to do electrical or plumbing inspections, however.

With no action taken at this time, Village President Harold Roseberry asked Garstecki to meet with Laidlaw for further discussion of the problem and to formulate plans for establishment of a proper routine.

Junior Hi School Grading Bids Due

TROY—The Board of education on Aug. 17 will open bids for grading and road work for approaches to the Baker junior high school.

The group also plans to authorize purchase of a school bus. First bids were rejected at the board's meeting last week.

At a meeting Aug. 3, the board authorized these purchases: window shades for the junior high and elementary addition to \$7,417.90; folding tables and folding benches for about \$2300 for the cafeteria in the elementary school; and a film strip projector for \$625 for the junior high school.

They waived examination last week before Farmington Township Justice Allen C. Ingie and one, Theodore T. Huesing was able to furnish \$500 bond each set by Ingie.

They are George R. Smith, 17, of 28405 Maitrot, his brother, Robert, 19, Donald L. Chandanais, 18, of 25559 Farmbrook, and Huesing, 18, of 28405 Maitrot.

Chandanais is accused of breaking into Spencer's service station at 30409 Grand River, Farmington Township, July 24, and taking a camera and flashlight.

THE OTHERS are accused of taking \$30 and cigarettes from Dodo's Drive-In at 26431 North-western, Southfield township, August 3.

Police said they are connected with a break-in at Gaffney's Buttermilk stand at Haggerty and Grand River, Farmington Township, August 3, and two break-ins in Hillman, one in Pinconning and one in Ypsilanti.

The Smith brothers also are serving a 60-day jail sentence for assault and battery of David G. Clark of 23011 Ingie, Farmington township, June 30.

FRANKLIN—Village officials felt "official" at their Aug. 9 meeting, when Treasurer Norman G. Currin announced the receipt of \$1,201 from Oakland county.

The monies, Currin explained, comprised Franklin's share of a tangible tax diversion as based on the recent population count.

Currin said the quarterly payment of tax diversion monies probably would be received soon and on the same basis, should be about \$1,400.


Opinion Postponed Until Next Week
