

Denison 'U' Claims One Of Nation's Beautiful Campuses

Denison University at Granville in central Ohio is recognized as one of the most beautiful campuses in the United States today. Literally speaking, the town and college are a bit of New England, nestled peacefully among Ohio's Licking Hills. As serene as this may sound, the University is a bustling community and one of the top-ranking small, private institutions serving young America.

Here's why: Denison University is a co-educational Christian College of Liberal Arts and Sciences founded in 1851. It is a Christian college in the sense that all its instruction is motivated by Christian principles and ideals. However, no attempt is made to force religion into a particular denominational expression and all advantages of the institution are offered to every student without discrimination.

THE FOUNDING in 1851 is significant. Denison has a long and proud history, but the date does not mean "dated." Constant building and refurbishing takes place; young professors with new ideas and methods are ever-present on the faculty; the student body is carefully selected and of the highest caliber; and new fields of interest are recognized and studied. Much of this is due to the progressive, dynamic leadership of the young president, Dr. A. Blair Knapp.

Denison is a college of liberal arts and sciences in which the development of the individual takes precedence over all other aims. A college of liberal arts and sciences offers general study in all major fields from Art to Zoology, and awards Bachelor of Science, Arts and Music. But before and regardless of the student's field of concentration, Denison requires its students to take a general education program. Every well-educated person needs certain skills and an understanding of the ideas, principles and methods which are commonly held in the chief areas of modern knowledge so that he may more intelligently assume his responsibilities as a citizen.

English, economics, science, history and philosophy are included in the common core of curriculum. With this background a person never becomes the one-sided intellectual who can only talk in terms of and about his own specialty; instead he has a grasp of other areas of achievement and is good company for himself and his associates.

IF YOU WILL remember, the main objective of Denison is the development of the individual and this emphasis extends to the social and artistic as well as the spiritual and intellectual development. Uncountable organizations have been formed for students interested in extracurricular activities, such as publications, dramatics, debate and music. Sports are not forgotten, but neither are they over-emphasized. Denison plays a full schedule of football, basketball, track and other team and individual athletics. Honorary groups and social organizations are numerous; there are twenty-four national recognition honoraries including Phi Beta Kappa, Omicron Beta Kappa and Mortar Board, and there are seventeen

Also, the outstanding freshmen, sophomores and juniors are honored for their contributions to campus life.

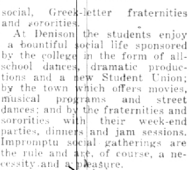
